In addition to our parish family, we have many seasonal members from throughout the United States and regular international attendees. Visitors know us to be a friendly, Christian, Bible-based community. That is who we continue to strive to be through the power and presence of the Holy Spirit.

Since 1980, Ascension has been an Episcopal church in the Diocese of Central Florida, located near the Town of Windermere and adjacent to the Dr. Phillips area in Orlando, Florida. We are a culturally diverse congregation that enjoys the richness of the Anglican liturgical heritage and sound biblical doctrine as we gather in prayer, worship and ministry.

We are excited to welcome a rector who will create experiences that will lead people of every age and at every stage in their faith journey to a deeper relationship with God and each other. We seek a leader who is able to relate, communicate and engage with our parishioners. We pray for an individual who



can shepherd our parish with empathy and loving compassion while bringing a new energy to the congregation. We need a rector who will follow God's vision to grow the congregation spiritually to be the disciples God envisions us to be.

WORSHIP + LITURGY

Sunday worship at Ascension follows the liturgies of the 1979 Book of Common Prayer. Holy Eucharist (Rite II) is the primary liturgical expression at our 8:30 and 10:30 services. Music is vital to our worship, as it is one way we connect with the Holy Spirit during worship. Music at the 8:30 service is drawn from The Hymnal 1982. Music at the 10:30 service is a blend of hymns and praise music from various traditions.

Our spiritual worship is enhanced through the various choirs and instrumental ensembles that participate each Sunday. Members of the Prayer Ministry team and the Order of the Daughters of the King are available to the congregation for individual prayers during Communion. In addition to our Sunday services, we have a regularly scheduled bi-monthly Order of St. Luke Healing service. We celebrate all major feast days.



We have strong lay involvement in all services. Lectors, Lay Eucharistic Ministers, acolytes, ushers, greeters, Altar Guild and audio/visual team members strengthen our worship time. Our team of Lay Eucharistic Visitors bring communion and companionship to our sick and home-bound parishioners. Our deacons are an ever-present source of support to the rector and parishioners.

Through our worship, the Holy Spirit speaks to us, helps us understand His Word, and equips us to do His work. All people are welcome into our community of Christian faith.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF ASCENSION

The Formative Years: 1980 – 2002

In 1980, 25 members of the Episcopal Church of the Messiah in Winter Garden, Florida, felt the call to start a new mission in the Windermere-Bay Hill area. Bishop William Folwell assigned Rev. Warren Richardson to assist in this effort. In May 1980, the Episcopal Church of the Ascension was formally installed by the Bishop as a new mission.

Worship services were initially held in Windermere Town Hall, then moved to Turkey Lake Park and were also held in Windermere Elementary School. A former 14-acre pine tree farm on the west side of Apopka-Vineland Road was located as a building site for the church. The church now stands on seven acres of that site. The southern seven acres were later sold by the Episcopal Diocesan Board to the Lutheran Church.

Rev. Martin Nelson became our first full-time priest in August 1981. Under his leadership, the first mission statement, "To Know Christ and Make Him Known to Others", was adopted.

Rev. Ronald Hooks was called to be the second priest in 1985. Church of the Ascension was elevated to "parish" status during his tenure. Under his leadership, two worship services

were established: 8:30 traditional and 10:30 contemporary. Small group involvement developed, a Healing Ministry was birthed, and church ministries expanded as the church grew. A dedicated youth minister was instrumental in building a strong youth program. During this era, the current mission statement, "To Make Disciples Who Make Disciples", was adopted and remains the mission of the church today.

CURRENT SANCTUARY

In 2003, Rev. James Sorvillo, Sr. was called to be our next priest. During this time, new families were joining the church, and the need to accommodate this growth was apparent. A prayer and discernment process for building a new sanctuary began. A committee was established to work with the rector and architect to design plans for the new building. The congregation participated in a building campaign and fundraising activities.

The new sanctuary for the Church of the Ascension was completed and dedicated to the Glory of God on December 24, 2008. This sacred, beautiful new space allowed the congregation to flourish and grow even further. Small group involvement increased. Bible studies, retreats, identifying spiritual gifts and

evangelism were now the cornerstones of the parish. During this time, Church of the Ascension was a strong participant in the life of the Diocese of Central Florida, as the rector and several members served on Diocesan Council and the Standing Committee. Members of the congregation, along with the clergy, attended diocesan retreats, meetings and conventions. Several past members of Ascension were called to ordained ministry serving the wider Episcopal Church today. We are living our mission statement, "To Make Disciples Who Make Disciples."



Over the following years, the Building and Grounds Committee members focused on campus improvements. The parking lot was repayed. The former sanctuary was transformed into a parish hall with an updated kitchen. Flooring was replaced in the classroom/meeting room wing of the church facilities. A new children's playground was completed. The grounds were completely redone according to the landscaping plan that accompanied the new building expansion. The church's Memorial Garden was renovated to become a peaceful, beautiful space dedicated to honor the memory of parishioners who have passed away. The Memorial Garden is a special visitation site for families whose loved ones are interred there.

As congregation growth continued, a new music minister joined the staff. Upon his arrival, his first mission was to research and select a new organ suitable for the beautiful sanctuary. At the beginning of 2010, a fundraising effort by the congregation was undertaken and resulted in a new organ being installed in October 2010. Under his leadership, Ascension choirs and instrumental ensembles presented opportunities for



children, youth and adults to participate in this ministry. Music programs were developed for the Lenten and Advent Seasons, and the enhanced Music Ministry took our worship experience to a deeper spiritual level.

With an increase in membership came an expansion of our children/youth programs and the Women's Ministry, and many spiritual growth opportunities were offered for newcomers. An assistant rector was added to the staff in 2015 to enhance our ministries, especially the Youth and Families Program.

The Order of St. Luke Healing Ministry was started with seven members in 2019. Within one year, the ministry grew to sixteen members with the focus of teaching Jesus' healing love to believers. The passion of this new ministry was exciting to the Ascension family. Once again, we were following the Great Commission.

In September 2019, Church of the Ascension commissioned fifty congregants to give birth to All Souls Church and formed this mission under the leadership of our assistant rector. "To Make Disciples Who Make Disciples" took on a whole new meaning as we were blessed to start this church plant. We were now a mother church. All Souls has begun the process of becoming an organized mission, which is in process for Diocesan Convention in January 2022.

The Covid-19 pandemic struck in March 2020, and in-person worship services were suspended. The clergy and lay leaders pivoted our worship to spiritually-engaging virtual services to include Morning Prayer, Sunday worship and bi-monthly healing services. These services kept our congregation engaged and committed. We have also remained connected in community virtually by continuing Small Groups, Women's Ministry, Men's Ministry, Seder Meal and other essential meetings. God has used this time to bring us closer to Him and to each other and challenge us to reach out in ways we never even thought of.

WHAT ASCENSION LOOKS LIKE TODAY

Ascension has resumed our two weekly Sunday worship services, and we are operating in compliance with all guidelines set forth by the Diocese of Central Florida. Our worship services can accommodate up to 50% capacity in our sanctuary with overflow available in our parish hall. Our 10:30 Sunday service is being livestreamed via our website and Facebook. Our Order of Saint Luke (OSL) Healing Service takes place on the second and fourth Tuesdays of each month and continues to be offered exclusively via livestream.

During the pandemic, many virtual opportunities were created and remain for the benefit of our parish, including Morning Prayer via Zoom on Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings. Many of our home groups continue to meet, either via Zoom or in-person with social distancing measures at the discretion of each group. The Women's Encouragement Group meets via Zoom on Thursday mornings. These offerings help us remain connected with a small-church family feel and encourage our mission "To Make Disciples who Make Disciples".

We are looking forward to reestablishing our children's ministry programming and hosting in-person Vacation Bible School in the summer of 2021. The Parenting Experience Co-op Preschool (<u>www.theparentingexperience.com</u>) is currently enrolling for the 2021-2022 school year. For almost 30 years, this preschool has offered a unique play-based and parent-involved learning environment and has consistently won awards as a top preschool in the Orlando area.



Ascension is known for our hospitality. We look forward to continuing our Greeter and Newcomer ministries to welcome visitors and new members in our ever-growing locale. As we welcome such a diverse body of believers, ranging in denominational backgrounds and spiritual maturity, our Ascension 101 program provides an excellent introduction to our community and the Anglican tradition.

We are blessed by many active ministries and look forward to God's continued movement and work in our midst as we grow in the coming years.






